#### Dear Friend and Neighbour

Aren't new babies delightful? By the time you receive this we may have met our yet-to-be-born fifth grandchild, and all the wider family will be delighted with a new life, a new beginning, a new chapter. For his/her mum and dad it will also mean change and challenge - and probably disruption too; that goes with the territory.

A wise friend reminded me recently that the only unchanging thing in life is that it's always changing. Disconcerting, isn't it? The well-known hymn has the line: "Change and decay in all around I see", but it makes me sad when people always equate change with decay. Change is mostly (although not always) good, sometimes vital; without it there's certainly decay. And decay gives off a rather nasty smell! But we welcome the freshness and vitality of each new Spring, with new blossom, new leaves, newly mown grass; that smell is wonderful. Change brings freshness and new life.

I've been tied into the school year for so long (even now - in my other job - I teach adults), that September means more to me in terms of new beginnings than January 1st. Children change classes or schools, parents think new uniforms, young people go up or come down from University, look for new jobs or consider the new experience of a gap year. And teachers welcome and readjust to new pupils / students. Change brings opportunity for growth.

God forgive us when we make God boring! God invites us to newness - to challenge, adventure, opportunity, growth - to a whole new life. It's scary, as it involves walking away from some things: bad experiences which have scarred us; behaviour which we regret; or simply ways of doing things which we want to move on from. But it's also exciting - ask anyone you know who follows Jesus to tell you about their journey.
