Last month I got guite cross if you hadn't noticed! - and described a god I don't believe in. God must get more bad press than even celebrities these days, and, regrettably, often from people who claim a Christian belief. In his time Jesus got particularly angry with the people who were supposed to understand what God is like, but who made him out to be some sort of harsh task-master or petty-minded tyrant. I think perhaps he might do the same today.

In direct contrast to that picture, Jesus was attractive, like a magnet (except of course to the religious leaders!). The ordinary people, and those who were on the outskirts of society for whatever reason - the leper, the cheat, the foreigner, the 'loose woman' - simply loved him. Because he loved them and they knew it.

Jesus made the outrageous claim that if people had 'seen' him, they had 'seen' God. So, if we're to believe that, God is good. God loves good and desires good - the good of all: the good of those who are

Christians, the good of those who follow God by another name, the good of those who profess no belief at all; he desires the good of individuals, the good of communities and the good of the world. Jesus shows us that God is accepting rather than forbidding, giving rather than demanding, forgiving rather than judgemental. After all, he shared his last supper with Judas the betrayer, even washed his feet. God is more than good; he is - in very essence - love.

Love, as we know from the familiar reading often used at weddings, is patient and kind, isn't envious or boastful, arrogant or rude. Love doesn't insist on its own way, it isn't irritable or resentful; it keeps no record of wrongs, but rejoices in the truth. Love can bear heavy loads, believes rather than mistrusts, and never loses hope. Love keeps on going on. This is the fundamental nature of God.

So what about all the evil in the world? Watch this space.

Grayswood to lose its No 70 bus service?

No services from Grayswood/Haslemere to Godalming, Guildford, Midhurst

If we are not very careful Grayswood will lose its main bus service from February 2005. It is apparently no longer economic for Stagecoach to run its buses through Grayswood because not enough people use the service.

Whilst it is recognised that Stagecoach have to make money and the majority of the village probably do not use the bus, it will be a desperate blow to those who

depend on it and be the loss of yet another village amenity. We will be left with two other services (the 59 and 504), which are comparatively limited in service and times.

Most of us prefer to use the car but we must also think of those who don't have one, or unable to drive or can't afford to own one.

Surrey County Council have a duty to consider the social necessity of uneco-

nomic routes and where appropriate to provide financial support.

If you are interested or concerned please contact your local councillor to express your views as soon as possible!

It is "disappointing" that so little effort has gone into consulting with the community on this decision. No notices on bus stops, no press advertising, no notices at the village hall—or are we all missing a trick here?
