Friends of ours in Devon have a profoundly deaf son. When we lived there, Jeremy was a teenager, highly intelligent and creative, but he had never heard speech, and he learnt to speak without knowing what it should - or could - sound like.

He lip-read embarrassingly well however, and perseverance in listening to him paid off; he could be witty and highly entertaining. His younger sister and our youngest, both called Mary communicated with him far more easily than most adults could. It did become slightly easier with practice, although it always demanded concentration.

That's a bit like the communication we call prayer. Like communication between two people, it can sometimes be easy and sometimes take great concentration and perseverance. We keep at it, not because there's any thought of changing God's mind or being reluctantly persuaded - what sort of a God is that?

It's more because we want to build a relationship with God, understand a bit more about cooperating with God in God's world. It's about wanting God's best in any situation.

God's best for every one of us is Life - with a capital 'L'. One of the wise men of the early church said, "The glory of God is a human being fully alive." So we like to pray a 'fully-aliveness' - God's blessing of goodness, peace, contentment - for all our friends and neighbours.
