4pm All done for the day; until tomorrow - early! Visit Covent Garden - haven't been there for years. Buzzing with people; great atmosphere. (8.10am) on 15th October, you 9.30pm Fall exhausted into bed too many underground tunnels and stairs - one station closed. Set alarm for 5am

> 645 Arrive and grab a coffee, nerves getting worse by the minute - this is going out LIVE! Apart from the choir, we can't see the congregation, but director tells us there are 1.6 million of them! They might be just waking up, cleaning their teeth, in the shower, on the way home from night duty - you name it. Listen to the choir's voice warming up ex-Chat to the other ercises. preachers and leaders a bit and get to know them; we are all strangers to one another. Appreciate our unity in Christ - and appreciate our differences. 7am

> rehearsal - beginning and ending of each little bit.

> 8 10 Red light goes on - on air

Thank God every Sunday is not like that; but also thank God for the experience – and the privilege.
