The Farmer's in his Den

My late father loved the Devon countryside and it was always a source of amazement to him that his sons were not interested in the Latin names of hedgerow flowers and plants, or in whistling the songs of the birds. However, in spite of my deficiencies, I have the fondest memories of more than thirty years of ministry as a country parson and the farming community has a special place in my heart.

I remember my first visit to a thriving family farm in mid-Devon. The farmer's wife offered me "a dish of tea" and before I could say anything she had called all the men in from the fields to meet the "Rector". The "dish of tea" turned out to be an enormous kitchen table groaning with food. I remember the little Norman church near Tiverton where I had to light the gaslights, prepare for Holy Communion, and then toll the bell, and as I did so I would look out of the narrow window in the belfry and watch the farmers walking across the fields to church. I remember the farmer, crippled with arthritis, who raised beef cattle on a muddy forty-five acres about 1000 feet above sea level, one of whose sons went on the gain a doctorate at university. If you asked them whether they wouldn't get a better return if they sold up and cleared their overdrafts and invested what remained, they would look at you as if you were mad. They love what they do and would never choose to do anything else. In the passing of the seasons they recognise God's care and yet they know that they are at the mercy of the elements

and that viral diseases such as foot and mouth are an ever pre-

sent threat. It has been heart-

breaking to see the present distress of men and woman whose herds have been slaughtered and whose life's work has been destroyed. They deserve our thoughts and prayers more than ever now.

Sunday Services

8.00 am Holy Communion every week

10.00 am services are very accommodating for families with young children—we have crèche facilities, fun for older children at Sunday School, and really don't mind if children make a bit of noise in church either! In fact we particularly encourage children to enjoy our church and join in with the first part of our service.
