Posada early for Christmas!

CHRISTMAS Although it's far too early to be thinking about some aspects of Christmas, it's not for this one as it would be good to be well organ-THIS (ized. Would you like to be part of a special 23 day long procession as part of your preparation for Christmas?

Posada is an old Mexican tradition where MAKING ROOM FOR young people dressed as Mary and Joseph travelled from house to house asking for a room for the night and telling people about the imminent arrival of Jesus in the weeks leading up to Christmas. On Christmas Eve they would visit the local church to re-enact the nativity and place figures of Mary and Joseph in a crib.

Modern day Posada uses nativity figures of Mary and Joseph who travel from place to place. Last year the 'Mary and Joseph' which are part of our simple wooden nativity set in Grayswood did this journey for the first time, and we'd like to repeat it this year, but involving more people, if possible. Will you be a host to Mary and Joseph for a night - sometime between 2nd and 23rd December? All you need to do is give your name and phone number to Janet in the Church Office (Mon, Wed, Fri, 9-12: 656504) by November 26th and offer a night that is convenient (and perhaps an alternative too). The person before you on the list will make arrangements with you to bring the figures to you, and in turn you will be responsible for taking Mary and Joseph to the next person on the list.

As Posada is an expression of hospitality and love, you might like to do something special - host a coffee morning for your friends, invite friends and family for a drink and sing a carol or two, have a dinner party – whatever. You can put Mary and Joseph in a window visible from the street with a lighted candle or in a prominent place in your home where they will be seen. You could even take them with you to the gym or the dentist, a restaurant or coffee shop. You might also want to put some money in a pot to give to a local project we are supporting this year. (We're not sure which yet, but there's no pressure to join in with this.)

If you'd like to join us for the beginning of the journey, do come to the Advent Communion service on 2nd December at 10am. Details of the (several!) endings of the journey will be in next month's Runner.
