A Happy Christmas and a Peaceful New Year!

It seems early to be writing that in the middle of November, when Advent hasn't even begun yet. Advent, the season when we prepare for the coming of God.

Firstly of course we celebrate that coming in the baby of Bethlehem, mysterious and wonderful as that is. Because of that first coming, as a human being who touched other lives with love and grace, we can know something about God – and something about what God is not like. We can know that God does not pontificate from a great height and even further distance, but that God is best expressed in terms of love and self-giving.

Then we are encouraged in Advent to look for the coming of God 'in glory'. Any explanation of that is fraught with difficulty, and must always be incomplete and inadequate; it's far too easy to be trite. 'Glory' is a word for the dazzling light of God's presence, which inevitably brings with it ideas of righting wrongs, of love and justice, of peace and joy. One day all that will be visible, obvious - glorious indeed. For now it's partial, sometimes almost impossible to discern, but it's coming.

Having seen what God is like in Jesus, we are also able to recognize the coming of God in smaller ways. The touch of a hand when we're sad, the time we spend with a friend, a letter out of the blue, quietly giving to the needy, noticing injustice and doing something about it, working for harmony in our community or for peace across the world - all evidences of love and self-giving. They are small signs of the coming of God now, mediated through ordinary human beings, possible because of the God 'veiled in flesh'.

So we have a three way view of the coming of God: then in Bethlehem, future 'in glory', and now, in the present moment. Even so, come Lord Jesus.
