The Way of the Cross

Dear friends

Every year, thousands of Christian pilgrims from around the world converge on the Old City of Jerusalem to celebrate Holy Week and Easter at the traditional sites of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. We can follow him, even be with him, 2000 years later, in our minds and hearts even if not physically. Will you join me?

On Palm Sunday we walk with Jesus into Jerusalem, and as they did then, we wave palm branches to welcome him as the King we're longing for, in order to set us free.

We spend the night with a sorrowful Jesus on the Mount of Olives in the Garden of Gethsemane. Do we fall asleep, like his disciples did?

We're there as Judas betrays Jesus to the authorities. Are we disappointed in him, like Judas was?

We listen to the travesty of a trial, where Jesus is condemned to die a criminal's death. Do we condemn him too, like Pilate did, even though we know him to be innocent?

On Good Friday we walk with Jesus as he carries his cross along the streets of the city to the place of execution, where he is stripped and whipped and nailed to a rough wooden cross. Do we weep with his mother, hide with some of his friends, or remain at his feet?

How are we feeling on the Saturday? Alone? Angry? Let down? Fearful?

And then, and only then, when we've walked the whole way of the cross with Jesus, do we experience the utter joy of Easter. And we join with others worldwide to shout

> Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Join us too for the 10am service on Good Friday and/or Easter Sunday.
