Dear friends

I've been thinking a lot about vocation lately. Not surprising perhaps, as my current batch of students, who have been my pastoral responsibility for the last three years, will either be ordained, or licensed as lay ministers, in the cathedral in July. At present, they're working hard to finish all the assignments, but that sort of vocation is much more than just understanding a bit of theology or having a few pastoral or preaching skills.

We've just been together over their last residential weekend of the training, and I asked them how they think they've been 'formed' into the sort of minister God wants them to be. Formed, not as in a sausage machine, where everyone comes out the same, but where, as they offer their individual gifts and, more importantly, themselves to God, they are transformed. Often, over time, I see a change of attitude, increased self awareness, awareness of others and a growing appreciation of difference – that we're not all the same and we don't see or do things in the same way. I often witness a growing humility as well as a growing confidence.

This of course continues through the whole of life, as everything that happens, during training, at work, and in life generally, contributes to what we call 'formation for ministry'. Sometimes, sadly, people begin authorised ministry without this deep transformation even having begun. Others – rightly - withdraw from the training at some point.

That sort of vocation is very specific, and other professions are vocations as well, but we – all of us - have a common vocation. Irenaeus, one of the early church 'fathers' (second century CE) said: '*The glory of God is a human being fully alive.*' That is our vocation, whatever else we might do: so to live that we are fully alive: self aware, aware of the other, appreciative of difference, allowing ourselves and our attitudes to be transformed by God through the events, even the mundane events of our lives, and always to be aware that we are in a state of becoming rather than think we have arrived.

To quote Cardinal Newman: 'To love is to change, and to be perfect is to have changed often.' Not to change is to die.
