Very common in art of years gone past. In Dali's portrayal you see Jesus' feet from below, and there's a delightful modern painting with a couple of feet sticking out of a cloud which makes me smile! Or perhaps you'd go for an abstract design which isn't representational? Where would you start?



What we're searching for is meaning. T.S. Eliot reminds us how easy it is to have the experience, but miss the meaning. Some of us insist on a literal event; others dismiss it as ludicrous, but what if we see it another way? 'Up' is obviously metaphorical, and if it's to mean anything at all to 21st century people today, it's worth exploring.

Imagine what it was like for those first disciples to have Jesus with them for three years and then to face the future without him. He could not be with them for ever – they would split up and spread out all over the globe. One creed says, 'he ascended into heaven to be everywhere present.' Precisely because he left them, he could be with them for ever. The Spirit of God would come, and will come, and does still come, to do Jesus' job - within each disciple. Now, the promise 'I will be with you for ever' is entirely plausible.
