God who is unaware and unconcerned with our lives, but one who is intimately involved with us. 'Emmanuel' means 'God with us'.

Jesus finished what he came to do, but we still pray 'Your Kingdom come; your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.' Jesus didn't finally put an end to all misery and devastation in the world; we know that too well. He didn't put an end to injustice and war, oppression and violence. He charged us, not only with the task of living by the standards of his kingdom of justice and peace, but also of passing it on to the next generation. But we are promised a time when the kingdom of God will come on earth. So in Advent we also look forward and prepare for whatever that future coming may hold for us and for the world.

I thought about what clip art image would illustrate justice and peace, but decided that it's best left to our imagination. As I prepare in Advent this year, I will let my imagination run: What would our world look like if God's will is perfectly done? What ingredients will it have? What things simply won't be able to exist? Is this then how I should pray?
