## Dear Friends

November is a remembering month. All Saints (1st); All Souls (2nd); Guy Fawkes (5th); the 'Fallen' (11th)

Sometimes we remember with affection, gratitude and love; sometimes also because it's good to remember something that we don't want to repeat.

The first of the above is special to us at All Saints Church; it's our patronal festival, a celebration which calls for cake with our coffee, a celebration which this year will include a Baptism – a new 'saint'. The usual understanding of 'saint' implies someone who is extraordinarily holy, as in the picture on the right, and who has performed miracles.



But the original meaning is simply someone who is a follower of Jesus Christ. That includes people of every age including the present. My favourite definition is: *Saints are ordinary people, both in the past and now, whom the light of God shines through.* 

Isn't it great when you meet someone who is transparent? Someone who's an open book – a WYSIWYG – (what you see is what you get!) Such people are easy to get to know; they're straightforward and honest, people of integrity. Don't we need more transparent people in our national life – politicians, business men and women, bankers and others? Such transparency however, is a handicap to those who are out for themselves. If you blush playing a game called 'Contraband', for example, you will certainly fail to convince other players that of course you aren't carrying the crown jewels through customs!



So imagine yourself in the stained glass window. Would the light of God shine through? Are you transparent? I love this one (left); it's alive, vibrant, colourful, dynamic, outwardgoing; all those words speak to me of God. Do they also speak of me? Hmm.
