Disaster or opportunity?

Dear Friends

Many of you will have heard by now that the church roof is in urgent need of repair. Following some tiles sliding off, a professional investigation revealed that there was a lot more damage under the surface – to the tune of (roughly) £100,000. Our first thought was – disaster! An impossible task for a relatively small church family.

Subsequent thoughts steered more in the direction of **opportunity** - an **opportunity** for us to demonstrate that the building is worth keeping and restoring,

Step 1 So I have challenged the congregation (including myself of course) to take this opportunity to reflect our generous God and be generous ourselves, to each give what we can – in the first instance without strings and without fundraising efforts. Someone said the other day that if 80 people Gift Aided £1,000 each, we would reach the target. That is certainly possible for some, but I'm well aware it is totally out of the question for others, and they will take more part in the fundraising which will follow (see step 2 below). Jesus praised the widow who put a small coin in the offering bowl because it represented so much more to her than those who were ostentatiously giving larger amounts. And although we don't have 80 families who belong to the church, someone has already extremely generously (and anonymously) given £10,000 to start the ball rolling.

It could also be an **opportunity** for the whole Grayswood community and perhaps even the wider community beyond, to contribute. Even if you don't come to church on a Sunday, I hope you'd still like the building to be there and available for the popular Christmas services and for weddings and funerals. (Yes, it could be that serious.) If you are a tax payer and would like us to be able to reclaim from the government 25% on top of the amount you give, all you have to do is put your money in a yellow envelope (on the shelf on the right as you enter the church) and fill it out. Otherwise use an ordinary envelope with 'Roof Fund' written on it. If you wish your gift to be anonymous, the sum you give will be known only by our Gift Aid manager and by no one else (including me).

So Step 1 is a simple, straightforward

Opportunities to give

- at a retiring collection at the end of the 10am service.
- between 3 and 5pm. Drop in to the church; someone will be there during those times.
- any other time that day or during the week 4th 9th. Collect a yellow Gift Aid envelope if appropriate, fill it out and drop it into Church House.

Many thanks – and I'll let you know the result.

Step 2 is a series of fundraising efforts, some of which are already being planned and a lot of which are opportunities to also have fun together. As 'vicar' I'm expected (I understand!) to do something outrageous - and that's being thought about too! I do hope you will join in.
