Harp Recital In All Saints Dear Friends

How's this for a quote: 'Success isn't having the top job in the biggest company any more. It's about how much control you have'. This from a young woman (quoted in the newspaper recently) who works in the business world. In context it was implied that she was talking not only about control over her own life but control over others. How sad that success is measured that way. Perhaps we take too much stock of people like William Henley, who in the mid-19th century wrote: 'I am the master of my fate: I am the captain of my soul.' It's an attractive proposition, because we all need to feel in control. Much argument for assisted dying, for example, stems from a fear of the lack of control over one's own life and a corresponding loss of freedom.

Of course I am free to make choices; of course I have some control in some areas of my life – choosing career, spouse or partner, where to live and so on. And yes, I may influence other people's lives. All that is very different from measuring success by the amount of control we have, which inevitably means a loss of control and a lack of freedom for others.

A friend of mine takes assemblies in a senior school and invites the young people who are shortly to be adults, to explore the difference in attitude between being competitive and collaborative. How different are our lives if we have as our goal success or having a servant heart? Which way of life is more consistent with the values of the Kingdom of God – generosity, harmony and justice? Which way of life brings inner peace and satisfaction?

Jesus paid for living that way - with his life. He refused to have control over other people's lives; he gave them freedom and enlarged their vision. Jesus also refused to take control over his own life and come down from the cross – even though he was challenged to do just that. On Good Friday we remember. But on Easter Sunday we celebrate God's vindication of Jesus' life and death.

Which will we choose – in our personal lives, our family lives, our business lives, our church lives? Competitive or collaborative? Success or service? We can live by the values of the Kingdom of God – or not. We can work together in serving others – or not. Living by those values may cost us, probably not our lives, but in time and effort, and perhaps money. Is it a price we are willing to pay?
