needed. The same is true of the church as people; we are not perfect.

Secondly together: as a church family we are like a building in process and we trust we increasingly reflect our gracious and loving God. The community of Grayswood is also a family, which, we hope, is increasingly generous and caring.

So, as the current work on the church building comes to an end, we remind ourselves, appropriately for Lent, that we are still a work in progress. Long may <u>that</u> work continue!

Greetings from Haslemere Food Bank to all the people of Haslemere and around who have so kindly donated food and funds over the past year.

Thanks to your amazing generosity we have been able to distribute about 250 food packs in this area to families who were in temporary financial crisis.

In addition to this, we were also very pleased to be able to distribute special Christmas Packs to 45 families who were struggling financially over the Christmas Season. Your donations of special

Christmas 'goodies' made this possible and it was very much appreciated by those who received these packs.

Thank you also for those who made a huge effort to collect, contribute and deliver Harvest gifts to the food bank. We were overwhelmed by the extent and variety of the donations which has meant that the food bank store is currently very well stocked with most products, although there are still certain items of which we regularly tend to run low in stock.
