Dear Friends

Purple is the colour of the season, and most people's experience is that it is a season for giving up things we like - chocolate or alcohol or our favourite dessert.

LENT

The children of Grayswood school would tell you that a **purple** season is for **preparing**. In Advent we **prepare** for Christmas; in Lent we **prepare** for Easter, and that usually includes self-examination and self-denial.

Lent was the season in the Early Church when people were **prepared** for Baptism. Admission into the Church by Baptism – the fellowship of Christ's people – and the celebration of the risen Jesus at Easter happened all in one go. What better beginning could there be?



This year in Grayswood we are following that pattern too. Two adults and three young people have just begun to **prepare** together for their Confirmation, when they will confirm for themselves the promises made by their godparents or sponsors at their Baptism and pray for and receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. They have some homework to do, then we discuss that – and all sorts of things – together, in order to understand a bit more what the Christian faith is about and how to read the Bible intelligently.

(It's all too easy to read it simplistically!)

As we carefully **prepare** for Easter, and as they carefully **prepare** for Confirmation, both through Lent, we know the hard work and sacrifices we make will help us enjoy the celebration more. These five people will be confirmed by the Bishop and confirm their Baptism promises in the Cathedral on Easter Eve in a large company of Christians; the next day in All Saints provides an opportunity for everyone who wishes to, to affirm their own Baptism vows.

I hope you too will enjoy your Lenten **preparations** this year.

The work to the **Garden of Remembrance** has been in progress, and the Contractors have laid new turf and edged it with everedge (according to the plan drawn up with the Diocese).

There is a gravel strip at the foot of the wall where small terracotta or stone pots can be placed with flowers or small plants.

This will make it easier for the grass to be cut regularly and for the area to be kept tidy. Until the new turf 'takes' and the first cut is done there will be a protective barrier around the area. Snowdrops have been planted beneath the turf though they may not come through in this first season.

We do hope that the improvements will be appreciated and that, together, we can maintain this as a peaceful and tidy place for everyone.
