At his coming to Mary and Joseph in the town of Bethlehem, his identity was initially known only to a few. He came as a human being, a vulnerable baby at that, learning and growing alongside us, with us in our work and in our homes, with us in our successes and our failures, in our joys and in our sadnesses. We are promised a Second Coming, when he is revealed in all the glory of God's heavenly realm – a different ball game entirely. There will be no problem recognising him then.
