We read the Easter story now with the benefit of hindsight and centuries of exposition, but what would it have been like to there - especially on that dark Friday? How would I have reacted?



Would I have been a loyal follower, as I like to think? Or would I have been a disappointed and frightened disciple seeing my world shattered and my hopes dashed? Or maybe an outraged priest seeing my most precious traditions and beliefs threatened by another fanatic? Or perhaps, like Pilate, I would have been intrigued and curious but unsure of how to respond? Or would I have been just another disinterested sceptic with deaf ears and no imagination?

It's a searching question and tough to answer truthfully – even more so when it comes to that extraordinary Third Day. Beyond the chocolate eggs and fluffy bunnies of today there is a profoundly challenging question: If, what is claimed to have happened on that Easter morning, DIDN'T actually take place, if it is just a myth, then millions of us are deluded, centuries of literature are erroneous, many socalled saintly and remarkable lives were misguided, and every place of Christian worship is a waste of space and should be bulldozed immediately. St Paul puts it very clearly in his first letter to the Corinthian Church: "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile .. and we are of all people most to be pitied."

But if, on the other hand it DID happen, if an extraordinary act of divine intervention all those years ago fulfilled an ancient Jewish prophecy, it might just be the most important piece of news ever recorded. It could also pose the most pressing and significant question any of us have to address today. The one thing we can't easily do is sit on the fence – it doesn't stand up. Intriguing. Happy Easter!

Pilgrimage to the Holy Land: November 2015

At 6.30 am the morning after our party of 35 arrived in Jerusalem (an early start, when we were reminded this is a pilgrimage not a holiday!) we went to the top of the Mount of Olives for an amazing view over Jeru-



salem before walking down the narrow road that Jesus walked into Jerusalem on that first Palm Sunday.

We were conscious of many people of different nationalities – very similar to the crowds that lined the streets 2,000 plus years ago – all curious to explore the ground Jesus walked on. We had a Communion service among the ancient olive trees in the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed agonisingly before his crucifixion, visited the church of Saint Peter Gallicantu (meaning cock's crow) which commemorates Peter's denial of Jesus, and the site where Caiaphas, the High Priest's house stood with its dungeon hewn in the rock below.

Jerusalem is full of colour, different cultures, history – a fascinating and vibrant city with narrow streets, old walls, steps and openfronted shops selling everything from spices to brightly coloured handmade scarves and rugs. We explored the four quarters of the old city (Christian, Jewish, Muslim and Armenian) all with distinctive characteristics; we walked the Via Dolorosa (the way of the cross) to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre on the site where Jesus was crucified on that first Good Friday. Here Ethiopian and Greek Orthodox, Syrian Coptics and Catholics all worship under the same roof, at the same time and in their own languages – a moving and encouragingly unifying experience. We ended that day with Holy Communion by the garden tomb where Jesus was laid before his glorious Resurrection which we celebrate at Easter.

A pilgrimage - would we recommend it? Definitely 'Yes'! David and Judy Culhane
