

WAYS TO MAKE YOUR SPENDING COUNT FOR YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY!



How many of us, these days, can resist the draw of online shopping, despite wanting to support local and independent shops?

Clicking a few buttons and receiving goods delivered direct to your door, can seem hugely more enticing to many than the thought of endlessly trailing round the shops!

A great many of the websites you possibly already use on a regular basis are now part of a scheme run by 'easyfundraising', and perhaps any twangs of conscience might be somewhat appeased by the thought of your purchase resulting in a donation to a local charity!

Retailers offering a percentage donation of the cost of an online purchase include grocery shops (eg Waitrose, Sainsburys, Tescos), purely on-line retailers (eg Amazon, ASOS), high street chains (eg Debenhams, M & S, Argos, Apple), florists (eg Blooms, Interflora), some holiday companies (eg Thomson, Thomas Cook), and many more. Whatever you are buying it is worth looking first to see if your retailer is registered at 'easyfundraising', and even considering ordering online to later 'collect in store', just to take full advantage of the opportunity to raise a donation!

To make the most of the opportunity and to see your 'contribution' growing, first register at easyfundraising.org.uk, and nominate your chosen 'cause of choice'. Alternative 'causes' within the village are Grayswood Nursery, All Saints Church, and Grayswood Cricket Club – any of these would be most grateful for your support – or you can look further afield to make a selection.

From then on, any time you wish to browse or buy, search for the retailer of your choice at the 'easyfundraising' site, and wait to be taken to their website. The total of the sale will be recorded and your chosen charity will feel the benefit of every



purchase you make! It's incredibly easy just a question of remembering! - and it's great to know that you are raising money for a good cause without it costing you an extra penny!

Not an on-line shopper? No worries! Another way to help benefit local children, is to collect 'Active Kids Vouchers' from Sainsburys, whenever they are available and you are shopping there. These can be dropped into the School reception, or left for Grayswood Nursery in the box in the foyer of the Village Hall. Again, any contributions will be most gratefully received.

Dear Fríends

As I write this on 9th April, the headline news is of the Archbishop of Canterbury's 'astonishing family past'. Journalists have been amazed by the way he has responded - and in the public eye too. Having admitted to being completely surprised, he said, 'I know that I find who I am in Jesus Christ, not in genetics, and my identity in him never changes'. A potentially damaging truth is met with openness, honesty and grace.

We can learn two important things from this for ourselves.

The first is that we know who we are and where our identity lies. I think particularly of people who have not had the privilege of happy secure families, but have even been rejected or damaged by them.

The security of knowing ourselves, whatever age we are, to be a child of God and part of the family of God can make a huge difference and cannot be taken away whatever the circumstances of our lives. It gives us inner peace and outer strength.



The second is a challenge to respond to what life throws at us with the same openness, honesty and grace which the Archbishop has demonstrated. Don't you wish our politicians and leaders would follow his example? It would be revolutionary! But how refreshing and how wonderful, not to mention how counter-cultural this is. It challenges me too, as to a far lesser extent I'm also in the public eye. I have to admit that I often respond with less grace than I should, if only behind closed doors and in front of close friends. But I'm working on it. How about you?
