


# Dear Friends

The commandment to do no work on the Sabbath appears to us a prohibition. 'Thou shalt not ..' is what we hear. But its origin is far from that, in fact the opposite. The Jewish people have been slaves in Egypt. They're cruelly treated and made to slave away for no reward, all day and sometimes all night, making bricks for their Egyptian masters.

Imagine being told, once you have been rescued from Egypt, you are now to be free from work one whole day a week, whether you're master, mistress or servant, whether you're the boss or the junior. That's a gift – as well as a statement of equality and of justice. It's a humanitarian ideal - we need it.

It disturbs me that many people today seem to be 'owned' by their boss; 7 days a week they receive

## Danger to church mice?


