BIBLE SUNDAY 29TH OCTOBER—What are we celebrating?

Thanks to various reliable websites I can tell you that the Bible is

- the best-selling book of all time world-wide sales of more than 6 million
- translated into over 2800 languages and dialects
- quoted by Shakespeare (directly or obliquely) at least 1200 times
- the most shop-lifted book in the world
- the least read book in the world
- written between 1900 and 3000 years ago
- the product of many authors and editors, speaking from and into a variety of very particular social, political and religious contexts.

Quite honestly, I wouldn't blame anyone who has a Bible on their shelves but never reads it. Although some passages are very familiar (the Good Samaritan perhaps or Psalm 23) it's certainly not an easy book to understand. The writers, especially of the Old Testament (or Hebrew Bible) were very sophisticated and often did their truth-telling about God by means of story - the most famous of these being the first Creation story in Genesis 1, which is marvellously poetic (obvious in English, but even more so in Hebrew) and is a deeply theological statement.

Very few Christians today actually insist on its literal truth. 'Is it true?' is not the best question to ask, as it invites a simplistic yes or no response. Language is much richer than that. Every language, including the three languages in which the Bible was originally written (Hebrew, Greek and Aramaic) uses different sorts of truth, some of which are literal, others obviously not. In the Bible we find examples of all those below:

historical - which might be written from any one of several perspectives;

scientific - not many, obviously, but there are rules for health and quarantining the sick which are still accurate by today's standards;

symbolic - evidenced in poetry, parables and myths; images of God as Rock or mother bird, Jesus as light or bread, the Holy Spirit as fire or wind; expressions like 'sweating blood';

aesthetic - found in art, novels or films, where we might say something is 'true to life' while not being factually true, like the parables Jesus told;

ironic - eg you are so wise said to someone who is being daft!

moral - what is viewed as right and wrong and is generally similar in all cultures of the world;

religious - to do with a person's personal and communal relationship with God.

Discerning these different sorts of truth is essential for reading the Bible properly. How is this true? is the best question to ask. Often, insisting on its literal truth actually robs it of its deeper meaning.

I hope all that helps some of you who may have thought that Christians have to leave their intelligence behind! There are other problems too, but they'll have to wait for another time.
