



## HOME GROUPS

We now have two groups running as the daytime group ceased when Barbara left.

The Wednesday group meets weekly during term time in the evening and numbers vary as not everyone can come each week. During the year we have examined Paul's letter to the Romans as well as looking at "Living the Good News" and "Developing spiritual character", the latter a series of studies prepared by John Stott. After Easter 2019, we shall have a look at John's gospel. We always begin with coffee and cake and end with prayer. The real strength of the group lies in its fellowship and caring for one another as well as being very informal and we have lots of fun together. As a group we continue to mentor Fiona as her ministry continues to develop.

Everyone is welcome so please do join us one month and see for yourself.

The daytime home group met on two Thursday afternoons a month with Barbara. They have looked at different "voices" in the Bible both in the Old and New Testaments which can seem at odds with each other. The group also explored two different styles of meditation.

The third discussion group meet monthly on the second Monday at Jane White's house. This year we have continued to use Rob Bell's videos as a springboard to our discussions. Some have been quirky, some challenging and one in particular – shocking. The conversation often goes off in very different directions. It is a safe space to talk about our faith, its challenges and our concerns.

There is no formula and all ideas and thoughts are shared and heard in the context of Christian love where we respect each other, regardless of differences of opinion.

## **Prayer Book**

A prayer book is available on the table at the back of church for written prayer requests that are included in the spoken prayers (intercessions) during the main Sunday Service over the course of a month. Requests can be re-entered on the next page for the following month if prayer is required for longer.

## **Church Service Prayer**

Each week during the 10am service one or two members are on duty to offer prayer one to one. This is available either during communion in the side chapel or after the end of the service on the weeks there is no communion. ## MUSIC

2018 has seen the choir numbers remain constant at 21, plus one family of four joining us when they can. This ensures that we can provide a good sized choir for most services. It is very impressive to see the youngsters grow from young children, giving dedication and commitment to the church and choir.

The Guildford area of the Royal School of Church Music has been reformed, and one of the highlights of the year was preparing for, and enjoying, the area choirs festival, held in the Cathedral in October.

The music was challenging, but a few singers from St Bart's and St Christopher's came to our Friday practices before we met up with other local churches for a rehearsal at Chiddingfold in September. Then eleven of us spent the afternoon prior to the service at the cathedral under the direction of Katherine Dienes-Williams, the Cathedral's director of music. There were over 100 singers who were joined by the Cathedral choir.

We have attended several United Benefit services with strength of numbers and feel that the united choirs should help considerably to unite the benefice!

Our church is affiliated to the RSCM which means that every member of our congregation is a member and can benefit from all that is on offer! Please ask Shirley Richmond if you want to know more.

We now have a strong bass line as Matthew and Johnny have moved to sit with the men, but would appreciate more altos and tenors. We hope that Anthony, our only tenor, will soon be back. We welcomed two adults, but sadly no Juniors, although the number of children who come to join the Song Squad and sit with us for the monthly All Age Service is increasing.

Our sincere thanks go to Rob Jackson for playing the organ for some services and practising with the choir men; also to Mary and George Gorniak for accompanying the All Age services and to George for relief organ playing. We really would like to form a music group.

#### MISSION LINKS

During the year we support four main missions, one throughout each quarter, through the donations that you put into the coffee tin each week and the donation bowl at the back of church. We do not take out expenses for the coffee but give all the money and to each quarterly mission the PCC has agreed that we add £300 from funds. In 2018 our quarterly missions were CMS (our Mission partners Jimmie and Katya working in Brazil), Through Faith Missions (working in the UK with which David Culhane is involved) and Skillway (vocational workshops for young people based in Godalming with Greg Bleach as the general manager). For the fourth quarter, which changes each year, we supported Toilet Twinning Africa – which seemed particularly appropriate as we were fundraising for our own accessible toilet to be put in the North Transept. The following donations were sent in 2018:

In addition we supported Grayswood school (£10 per child)), Grayswood Nursery (£250 a term), Tear Fund (£100) from our Christmas card donations, the Bishop's Lent appeal (£300), Send a Cow (£280), from our Harvest collections, the Poppy Appeal, the Children's Society and Christian Aid (sent direct).

## **MAINTENANCE TEAMS**

## **BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS**

We are very grateful for our Buildings and Grounds team who watch over the church and its surrounds, spending many hours keeping it to a high visual standard. David Hutton and volunteers make up the team and have recently been joined by John McLean who has kindly accepted the role of Team Coordinator. They also look after the maintenance of the Garden of Remembrance.

After due diligence, the contract for the main grounds maintenance was awarded to Andrew Obee, Wisborough Green, West Sussex.

A survey to review potential electricity savings by installing LED lighting was undertaken in 2018, but due to other building priorities, this project has been placed on hold.

During 2019 there were significant alterations to the north transept area. The main works included, but not limited to, converting the vestry into a Church office, adding a disabled toilet, new kitchen area incorporating a sink, dishwasher, fridge and general storage area. A new more efficient boiler was also installed.

Following the dry summer of 2018, it was noticed that many surface areas within the Churchyard had sunk, including graves and grave stones. Remedial action to 'top up' the sunken graves with soil will commence in Spring 2019.

## **FLOWERS**

We have a gifted flower team and each week (except during Lent) we ensure that there are flowers in church for all to enjoy. Sasi Cave took on the co-ordinating of the team during 2018 and designed and created, on our behalf, a moving and stunning display for the Haslemere Remembers flower festival held in September in St Christopher's church. The design included a copy of the Axel Haig Memorial stone, skilfully made by John McLean and the names of those on our Memorial tablet were produced in beautiful calligraphy by Rosie Edwards. Thank you to all who are so generous with their time, who give flowers and keep them watered during the week and who make the church look so lovely.

## PLANNED GIVING, GIFT AID AND CHURCH SERVICE COLLECTIONS

The total Standing Order and plate collections for 2018 was £40,340 which was £540 more than in 2017. Standing orders account for three quarters of that income. Standing Orders increased by £1,055 and church collections decreased by £515, most of the Standing Order increase was due to people transferring from envelopes to standing orders, some with an increased donation. In general there have been very few increases during the year in established individual donations by envelope or Standing Order.

The shift towards donation by Standing Order has continued and this makes it much easier to predict income and the budget accordingly. The fact that so many members are prepared to commit to a regular Standing Order payment instils great confidence for the future.

Gift Aid remains strong and the total HMRC rebate was £11,065 for 2018, this figure includes £1,004 of rebate from donations received for the North Transept project. The HMRC rebate is made up of two parts, the standard Gift Aid and a new scheme for small donations which are not made under Gift Aid. The new scheme has resulted in almost all donations not Gift Aided, of £20 or less, being eligible for an HMRC rebate. However the small donations scheme only works when the Church has a healthy standard Gift Aid scheme, so it is very important that if you can donate under Gift Aid that you do so. For one-off donations please use the yellow envelopes in the church pews and fill in your name and address. For regular donations please join the scheme using the form at the back of the church, If you have any queries please talk to me either in church or by phone.

The planned giving scheme currently has 43 individual members and 20 family members which represents 83 adults and their children which is an increase of 2 on 2017.

Finally I would like to thank the sides people for their diligence in marking up the collection envelopes each week and also to Judy Culhane for providing banking details so that we can claim HMRC rebates.

Well done and thank you to everyone who donates time or money to help run the church.
