Do you fancy going on a cruise, but don't like the idea of being tossed about on a rough sea? Perhaps river cruising is the answer. I have just returned from a cruise on the Rhine, and thoroughly enjoyed it.

As the boat sailed serenely along, there was always something to see. Rural countryside, tall cliffs with castles commanding the area, small towns and villages, and areas of industry. There were many power stations, some nuclear and some coal-fired or burning waste.

The river itself was busy with other cruiseships and many barges, loaded with coal, cars, tractors and a good many containers. How sensible to keep all this off the roads!

Every day, we stopped at some towns, small or large, for a gentle stroll or a guided tour. Many buildings were beautifully restored after the war, but Heidelberg was untouched by bombing, and still kept its original buildings. The beautiful cathedral in Cologne had not suffered much damage, but the railway had been built very close, so the building is black with soot.

The highlight for me was a cable car across the river at Koblenz, to reach the fortress on the opposite side. The views were fantastic and I wouldn't have missed it.

I can certainly recommend a river cruise.
