# WASSAIL

### Saturday 18 January 3.00-6.00pm

We are planning our first ever Wassailing event ahead of the first growing season for our apple trees which were planted back in the GRAYSWOOD Nursery and Forest School

summer. Of course, we don't expect a bumper crop or anything like it. But we mean to wish our young trees every success.

Wassailing is an early English term related to the old Saxon greeting Wæs þu hæl, meaning "be thou hale" ie "be in good health". To Wassail an orchard is an ancient tradition which has various forms but is essentially about wishing a healthy growing year to our apple trees and warning off any spiteful beasties at the same time. A procession of torches will make its way to the Orchard from our woodland where we will sing a few seasonal songs. Refreshments will be involved of course (on an apple theme), both child and adult varieties... simple fun and a great story too from a visiting professional story teller...
