

GRAYSWOOD GARDEN CLUB

As Chairman of the Grayswood Garden Club you might think that our garden would be smart and "well in order". No, I am usually too busy doing all sorts of other things. Mostly our garden takes care of itself but the recent period of restriction has resulted in my spending a little more time working in it. I have still had to juggle this between riding my horse, doing essential fencing at the field and many phone calls to my 91 year old mother who is isolated in her flat near Bristol, as well as keeping in touch with family and friends in these unusual times.

One of the problems with gardening during lockdown has been obtaining plants and compost. Friends have used local garden centres. Luckily for me I had bought some compost and plants just before lockdown and have since bought a few plants at petrol stations!

I have focussed on a front garden bed that already has established rhododendrons and azaleas planted by my husband's father many years ago which are stunning when flowering. There is also a super old acer.

Weeding and adding composted material were essential first steps as this area had been rather neglected. The primroses were already flowering and I had previously planted some hellebores, iris and pulmonaria. Aquilegia are in abundance, self seeding each year. I added some Tête-à-tête, Bellis Perennis and Forget-me-nots together with some violas and pansies for instant colour. The garden keeps changing and now the fabulous iris are flowering. There are Day Lilies and Geranium to look forward to and the one Alium that has survived from last year. For next year, hopefully, some grape hyacinths and foxgloves. Nothing especially grand but so pretty. Next I will be onto the back garden perhaps whether lockdown continues or not?

With all the extra effort people have put into tending their gardens perhaps a late "Grayswood Open Gardens" event may be possible.* Who knows? It would be a great shame not to see some of them, though not mine! Janet
