# Dear all,

As I write this, we are at the end of the first week when all shops have been allowed to re-open. I know some people have been delighted to have the opportunity to get out and do some retail therapy but I have chosen to stay away for now, other than doing the food shopping. This change has caused some anxiety in those who are still shielding or who fall into the vulnerable category. For them, the real possibility of being infected means that they are still having to remain at home, whilst maybe envying others who have more freedom. Allowing single people to join a bubble has been wonderful for many, but has also meant that some people have had to choose which of their children to see, again causing discord amongst families. It is not easy!

As of the 24th June we have made the decision to re-open the church for private prayer on a Wednesday and a Saturday between 10-12. Please do feel free to come in as we have put in place procedures to ensure that it is safe to do so.

Gates and the church door will be open, hand sanitiser will be available on entry and you will be directed to a pew that has not been occupied for at least 72 hours previously. Unfortunately, the toilet will not be available to use and only the main body of the church will be accessible. We will have a prayer tree in place if you wish to write a prayer and there will be the opportunity to light a candle if you wish to.

We are still waiting to hear when we may be able to gather again for worship, but in the meantime do feel free to join us for our zoom worship on a Sunday at 10 am. Some people will be zoomed out during the week with work calls so may not feel able to join in so, I would encourage you to find an alternative source of spiritual encouragement. There are many online services that are pre-recorded that you could watch whenever you like, including our own Bishops whose video sermons are available every week. https://www.cofeguildford.org.uk/resources/clergy/sunday-sermons

Or I would recommend downloading the Lection 365 app https://www.cwr.org.uk/lectio365 which I have found especially helpful during this challenging period of time.

Whatever option you choose to sustain your faith, know that God has not abandoned us but is watching over us and providing each of us with the strength to manage whatever we are faced with one day at a time. And if you have found yourself asking questions about God during this time and would like to have a conversation then please do give me a call.

# GRAYSWOOD CLUB QUIZ NIGHT




Grayswood Club continues to have a quiz on the last Thursday of each month.
