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# Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2020

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

All Saints Church, Grayswood Road, Grayswood, Haslemere GU27 2DJ is part of the United Benefice of Haslemere (St Bartholomew and St Christopher) and Grayswood, in the Diocese of Guildford. The Parochial Church Council of All Saints Church Grayswood (PCC) is a charity registered with the Charity Commission (Registered charity number 1190786).

# **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

### **Objectives and activities**

All Saints PCC is responsible for co-operating with the Associate Minister Revd. Fiona Gywnn in promoting the parish of Grayswood the whole mission of the church - pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Our vision statement is "**For God, for one another, for the world**".

We seek to reach out to, and serve all who live in the village, as well as those who live beyond the parish boundary who are regular worshippers at All Saints, and to demonstrate God's love and generosity in various ways. We compile, edit and print a monthly newsletter (The Grayswood runner) which is delivered to every house in the village, and through this we communicate both church and village activities. The Friends of All Saints (who fundraise for the maintenance of the church) organise various social fundraising activities, which attract members of the community who are not regular worshippers. Unfortunately, planned events e.g. a Jazz evening and 'open gardens' were cancelled due to Covid 19. Other regular events have similarly been disrupted this year, such as the weekly parent/carer and toddler group in the village hall and the monthly coffee, cake and chat in the village club. Fi, our Associate Minister, is a Governor of the school and takes weekly assemblies and oversees the RE curriculum. The end of term school services, main festivals normally held in church and assemblies have similarly been cancelled or changed depending on the guidelines at the time.

Our focus for 2020 was 'Embedding Christ in the community'. When this was decided it was not known what lie ahead - physical meetings and services have been restricted or cancelled. The website information has been kept up to date. We have set up a phone 'buddy' system to keep in touch with those who are vulnerable. Service sheets and the weekly newsletter have been delivered to those unable to access online services. There has been greater cohesion in the village, evidenced in offering support for each other and the local food bank.

# Grantmaking

During the year we support three main missions, one in each quarter of the year. Skillway (a local charity that provides vocation training workshops for young people), Through Faith Missions (a national body) and CMS and our fourth quarter is changed each year. This year we supported Christopher's Smile (a children's cancer charity, one of its roles is funding research). Each quarter the PCC adds a contribution of £300 to the total collected for these missions. We support the local school and nursery school and during 2020 we contributed to the Bishop's Lent appeal.

# **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Volunteers

We would like to thank all the volunteers who work so hard to make our church the lively, vibrant and caring community that it is.

Our housekeeping costs are covered by donations and fundraising events. Many of these have been cancelled this year, including the twice-yearly fayres, which were replaced by smaller, outdoor plant and cake sales. We are grateful too to our buildings and grounds team who keep a careful watch over the church and churchyard, and the team of volunteers who look after the Garden of Remembrance. We very much appreciate the Friends who support us in the maintenance and improvement of the church building and all who give generously during the year.

### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Review of the year

There are 109 members on our electoral roll and the average attendance on a normal Sunday prior to the first national lockdown in March was 65. This includes 10 children or young people. Our weekly attendance at online services varied between 43-54 adults. Our Christmas services: Christingle (in lieu of Crib Service, held online): 21 adults and 15 children; Christmas Eve: 24 adults attended a service in church (the maximum permitted number) and on Christmas Day: 25 adults and 6 children attended church with a further 31 adults and 2 children joining online. Our school services could not be held but weekly assemblies were held online.

We had 6 weddings, 2 baptisms and 5 burials/burial of ashes during the year and 7 funeral services held at the crematorium.

Our PCC had six full meetings in 2020 which all began with a reading and prayer. Three meetings were held via zoom due to Covid restrictions and there were no Deanery meetings for the same reason. We include in our agendas, at most meetings, a main item of particular interest or challenge in addition to covering routine matters. In January our main item was our focus for the year, which we agreed would be 'embedding Christ in the community'. Our aim being to increase links with the school and have a greater connection with the village. Following her installation service as Associate Priest in February, Revd. Fi Gwynn spoke about her vision for the future at our March meeting. This included increased numbers in Sunday school and more families involved, increased numbers in study groups and prayer triplets, a thriving pastoral team with social events through the year. A steering group was launched to look creatively at Sunday services and our connection with the village.

Each week we meet after church for coffee and refreshments in the village hall and much value the social contact and fellowship this provides. Unfortunately in 'lockdown' this was curtailed and replaced by 'chat rooms' after the zoom services. This facilitated conversations with people who perhaps could not attend a physical service, did not know each other, developing new contacts and friendships. Our home groups and Lent course, which are Bible studies and an opportunity for spiritual development, were both cancelled due to Covid restrictions. There were excellent resources on the website leading up to Easter including meditations and reflections. Our prayer triplets have continued and a prayer chain, which is much appreciated and each month we pray for a different area of our village.

Our church building is in good order and our new lighting design has been approved. The conversion to LED lights will be a significant cost benefit and a step towards sustainability. A new handrail was installed at the choir vestry steps funded by the Friends. We have risk assessments in place and continue to monitor our safeguarding responsibility. Our log book and terrier are kept up to date.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

# Financial review

#### Unrestricted funds

The total receipts on ordinary unrestricted funds were £72,181, as detailed in the financial statements. The expenditure amounted to £61,889, together with gains on Investments of £660. This resulted in net income on unrestricted funds of £10,952 for the year.

As a result, the unrestricted fund totalled £60,358 at 31st December 2020, of which the PCC has designated £13,928 for specific purposes as shown in note 15 of the accounts.

#### Restricted funds

With plans to instal a new lighting design and conversion to LED lights in the church, no further restricted income has been received in 2020. However, £1,294 has been spent on initial planning costs for the lighting upgrade.

#### **Reserves policy**

It is our policy to invest our funds balances with the CBF Church of England Deposit Fund and there was £6,250 in this fund at the end of the year.

We aim to maintain a minimum of 3 months' expenditure within this fund, but at the year end the balance remained in the PCC's current bank account. The PCC is pleased to report that reserves overall have increased by the net surplus in the year of £9,658 to £86,814

#### Designated funds

£18 was donated to the Church Music Fund and £278 was spent on church music from this fund. This left £13 available for music at the year end. In addition £130 was collected from the Mission Fund and £151 was expended. This designated fund had therefore been fully utilised at the year end.

With the completion of the North Transept Project, no expenditure was incurred from this fund in the year. The balance on this fund of £2,855 was therefore transferred to the new designated lighting fund as directed by the trustees. This designated fund will help contribute to the planned lighting improvements, and sits alongside the restricted fund containing donations for this purpose. £9,500 of donations were designated by trustees for lighting which, together with the remaining £2,855 brought forward, was transferred from the completed North Transept project, leaving £12,355 available for the lighting works.

There has been no expenditure from the Quinquennial fund, leaving an available balance for this purpose at the year end of £255.

Finally, Vicar's discretionary fund received £200 in donations and spent £1,395 for the purpose of making small grants to individuals facing hardship, leaving £1,105 available for future assistance.

#### **Restricted fund**

The Reservation of Graves Fund had no movement in the year, leaving a balance of £1,650 at the year end.

The lighting fund received no additional income in 2020, with £1,294 spent on initial planning expenditure for the project. This leaves £24,706 to be spent on the lighting conversion from restricted funds.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The Parochial Church Council of All Saints Church Grayswood (PCC) is a registered charity, number 1190786, and is controlled by the Church Representation Rules.

# Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and to stand for election to the PCC.

# STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Organisational structure

The PCC operates through one committee and through the following teams for ministry and mission (each with a co-ordinator) which meet between full PCC meetings. All teams are answerable to the PCC, all are about ministry (serving the people of God in many different ways) and all are about mission (joining in with God's mission in the world in all its diversity).

#### Standing Committee:

As the only committee required by law it has power to transact the business of the PCC between its meetings, subject to any directions given by the PCC. It is also responsible for forward planning and developing worship and corporate prayer.

Worship and Learning Teams:

These teams cover Sunday school, music, prayer ministry, home groups, and special services.

#### Mission Teams:

We have teams responsible for our newsletter to the village, Autumn and Spring fayres, special events and services, Alpha or similar courses, hospitality on behalf of the church and for other outreach events and liaising with our school.

#### Pastoral Teams:

These teams, with our three pastoral assistants, have a particular responsibility for the pastoral needs of the parish. Representatives cover each road in the parish and electoral roll members who live outside the parish, ensuring that any particular needs are addressed, and that newcomers are welcomed. In addition they organise Harvest gifts which are delivered with the help of the school children, occasional offices and care for church members.

#### Maintenance Teams:

Finance, care of the church building, its contents and grounds, and disability needs are covered by these teams.

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

# Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

• the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Donations, Legacies and Collections

Collections are recognised when banked by or on behalf of the PCC. Planned giving receivable under Gift Aid is recognised only when received. Income tax recoverable on covenants or Gift Aid donations is recognised in the accounts when the gift is received. Grants and legacies are accounted for when the PCC is notified of its legal entitlement and the amount due is probable.

#### Other trading income

Parochial fees due to the PCC for weddings, etc. are accounted for on an event by event basis. Fundraising Activities are recognised when received.

#### Income from investments

Dividend and interest income are accounted for when received as is any income tax recoverable on such income.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

#### **Church Activities**

The diocesan parish contribution is accounted for when paid. Any parish contribution unpaid at 31st December is provided for in these accounts as an operational (though not a legal) liability and is shown as a creditor in the balance sheet.

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# 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Churchyard equipment	-	25% on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings	-	25% on reducing balance
Office equipment	-	25% on reducing balance

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the accounts by section 10(2) to (4) of the Charities Act 2011.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Part of the unrestricted fund which the PCC has, at their discretion, set aside for a designated purpose. Designated funds are also used where donors have expressed a preference without imposing a trust. The funds so designated remain unrestricted since the PCC can remove the designation at any time

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Investments

Investments are a form of basic financial investment and are initially recognised at their transaction value and subsequently measured at fair value as at the balance sheet date using the closing quoted market price. The statement of financial activities includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluations and disposals throughout the year.

Realised gains and losses on investments are calculated as the difference between sales proceeds and their opening carrying value or their purchase value if acquired subsequent to the first day of the financial year. Unrealised gains and losses are calculated as the difference between the fair value at the year end and their carrying value.

#### **Current Assets**

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31st December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors, less provision for amounts that may prove uncollectible.

Short-term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the CBF Church of England Funds, or at the bank.

#### **Reservation of Graves Fund**

This restricted fund represents monies received for the reservation of graves.

#### Lighting Fund

This restricted fund represents a donation for a new lighting design and conversion to LED lights in the church.

#### **Designated Funds**

The Designated Funds represent monies set aside by the trustees to be used at their discretion. These consist of the North Transept Project, which is for the development of the North Transept to include a toilet accessible to all and to put the office into the vestry, the Mission fund, from which collections for quarterly missions are paid, a Music fund to assist with costs associated with the organ and choir, the Quinquennial fund to assist in the care and repair of the church building, and the Vicar's discretionary fund for the purpose of making small grants to individuals facing hardship. The designated lighting fund is money that the trustee's have set aside to supplement the restricted donation received in 2019.

# 17. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

Aggregate donations received without conditions from trustees amounted to £6,340 (2019: £4,420). In 2019 £26,000 was also received from Potter Owtram and Peck solicitors for the upgrading of the church's lighting, a firm of which A Ramsden (Trustee) is a partner.
