As we celebrate Harvest at All Saints on Sunday 3rd October this year we will once again be collecting food for the Haslemere Food Bank. In an area as affluent as this I still find it heart-breaking that there continues to be such a great need for the food bank. However, we have always balanced the local need with looking beyond our immediate neighbours to helping those overseas. With the situation in Afghanistan so prominent in the news it was only right for us to think about those refugees who are struggling to find new lives elsewhere. When the PCC met to discuss our options, we took the decision that we wanted to support an agency that wasn't solely looking after Afghan refugees, but to one that was supporting all refugees, which is why we have chosen to donate any money given to UNHCR - the UN Refugee agency. Not only do they help with food and shelter, but they also act on behalf of the refugees as advocates, helping them to find new opportunities, to fight sexual exploitation, abuse and harassment.

Whilst many, not all, in Grayswood will have plenty of food on their tables and in their fridges and freezers, it is more important than ever that we look outward and share what we can with those who aren't as fortunate as us. We cannot choose the country we are born in, but we can choose to share the gifts that we are given.

Contributions to the food bank can be left in church on any day of the week and if you would like to make a financial contribution to UNHCR then this can be left in the letter box in the porch.

Maybe you can pause at a mealtime this month to consider how fortunate you are that you have ready access to food and water. I know I will be.


