Remembrance Day Special: A Call to Spy Sunday 13th November, 2022 - 5 pm

Established in June 1940 in London, the Special Operations Executive (SOE) was a volunteer force set up to wage a secret war behind enemy lines through espionage, sabotage and the building of a resistance network in occupied Europe. Dozens of women were recruited by the SOE. Agents for F Section, which was responsible for the recruitment and deployment of agents into France, were trained locally, at Wanborough Great Barn.

The film will be followed by a Q&A session with Carol Brown and Ray Windmill of The Secret WW2 Learning

Network. All proceeds will be shared by two charities:- Chiddingfold Village Hall & The Secret WW2 Learning Network


