HASLEMERE FOOD BANK

Record numbers of food parcels have been given out across the UK in the past 12 months, as the UK cost of living crisis has helped drive more people to food banks for the first time. Many using the food bank are in work reflecting the difficulties many low-income households have in affording everyday essentials amid soaring energy bills and food prices. The Haslemere Food Bank shelves are looking depleted yet again. A food bank volunteer writes, *"I thought I would try to put into perspective the quantities of food we need each week by sharing some of the foodstuffs that we distributed on a typical week in June. We gave out 152 tins of baked beans, 38 jars of coffee, 76 tins of tomatoes, over 60 kg of dried pasta and 33 kg of rice. Not to mention all the tea, tinned fruit, tinned veg, tinned pulses, puddings, UHT milk, pasta sauce, biscuits and more that were also distributed."*

"For perspective, when I left the food bank one day this week, this is the quantity of each of the following items left on our shelves: Coffee x 0, Pasta sauce x 5, tinned tomatoes x 5, tinned fruit x 3, custard x 0, UHT milk x 0, oats x 0, couscous / noodles x 4, tinned potatoes x 4, baked beans x 76"

Bug mansions and nature trails

The churchyard at All Saints made its debut at this year's **Grayswood Open Gardens**. It was great to see people enjoying the churchyard and the resident wildlife and nature.





We set up some activities for our younger visitors including a nature trail around the churchyard, sunflower planting and some "build your own" bee hotels!

The children all seemed to thoroughly enjoy making their bee hotels and our special thanks goes to lan Neilson who handmade all the kits and provided detailed instructions for the children to follow. We hope that in due course the hotels will become fully booked in the children's own gardens.

At the back of the churchyard, with some help from some little hands on the day, we have built the Church's first ever **'bug mansion'**! Please do come and take a look when you're next visiting. We look forward to welcoming a whole host of bugs to take up residence. ...

We also held our first **wildlife survey** during the open gardens – as well as some interesting sightings by some of our younger visitors, we were fortunate enough to have Gareth Matthes visit on the day. Gareth is a professional ecologist and compiled a comprehensive list of all of his sightings.

- * Flowers: bush vetch, ox-eye daisies, common spotted orchids, knapweed, common sorrel, meadow buttercups, marsh thistle, white and red clover, sweet vernal and Yorkshire fog grass
- * Grasses: cock's foot grass, false-oat grass, field woodrush, timothy grass, red fescue, perennial rye grass, bents and meadow grasses.
- * In the surrounding woods there are oak, ash, blackthorn, hazel, elder, hawthorn willow and ferns.

We were delighted to see such an extensive list of plants, trees and grasses

as well as 'evidence' of dormice living nearby! We are thrilled that a previous decision to 'selectively mow' the churchyard has proven to be so successful in encouraging bio-diversity in the grounds.

If you would like to conduct your own wildlife survey in the churchyard later in the year, please complete the survey report at the back of church so we can improve our understanding of the space.

The churchyard is always open. Come and have a wander round.
