

Faith in times of war and conflict

Rev Lionel Ouvry, was the Vicar of Grayswood between 1961 to 1974. He had previously served with the Royal Army Chaplains in Italy, one of 3500 chaplains who served in WW2. When you visit the church, you will see a small wooden two-piece cross, very plain and simple and yet what a history. The cross was used by



Chaplains deliver pastoral care to everyone, provide or facilitate spiritual support and give moral guidance to the whole force and their families irrespective of faith, world philosophy or status. They have non-combatant status and are banned from carrying weapons, even on parade.

He heals the broken hearted and binds up their wounds." (Ps 147:3)

We pray for the PEACEMAKERS, for

resilience and resource for NGOs frontline workers and medics search and rescue teams. active and efficient peacemaking at an international political level.

May the measured voices of diplomacy constrain violence on every side—Blessed are the merciful for they shall be shown mercy, Blessed are the peacemakers for they will be called the children of God. (Matthew 5: 7-9)

We pray for the POLITICIANS; for

wisdom to co-operate and communicate well good and speedy decisions for those worst afflicted a miraculous de-escalation of these dangerous conflicts reason to prevail over rage and revenge

May those with an interest in escalating these crises somehow be restrained. "Jesus stood up and commanded the wind, "Be quiet!" and he said to the waves, "Be still!" "(Mark 4: 39)

We pray for the PASTORS; for

strength as they process their own trauma resilience to bind up broken hearts, care for the poor, arrange funerals and preach the gospel of Jesus Christ. "When you hear of wars and rumours of wars do not be alarmed" (Matthew 24:6)


