January is always a tough month, I certainly didn't want to add to the gloom by doing dry January but well done to you if you did.

Due to the peculiarities of the church calendar, and the date of Easter being set by the cycle of the moon (yes really), Ash Wednesday is on the 14 th February this year.

Easter is always on the first Sunday after the first full moon that follows the spring equinox. But this full moon is an ecclesiastical full moon (ecclesiastical means 'of the Church'), and so wasn't calculated in quite the same way modern astronomers would.

On top of that, for the purpose of calculating Easter, the spring equinox is always on 21 March. In 2024, the first Sunday after the first full moon following the 21 March is Sunday 31 March. These rules also mean that the earliest possible date that Easter Sunday can fall is the 22nd March. The last time that happened was in 1818! So whilst it may feel like Christmas has only just happened we are already planning Easter! We are looking to add a few new things into our Easter offerings this year so do keep reading for details of when these will be happening.

JOY

She was only able to speak in a whisper and was mostly paralysed from the neck downwards. Joy was 33 and had been knocked down by a drunken driver ten years earlier. He had mounted the pavement at speed in his car, colliding with her and breaking her neck.

Now sailing in the Atlantic in the early hours in a gentle breeze, under very bright stars with no cloud, all was peaceful and quiet. With 49 other people on board, mostly asleep, Joy was on the bridge of Lord Nelson, a square rigger with nineteen sails, belonging to The Jubilee Sailing Trust and purpose built for disabled people. Her wheelchair was strapped to the deck in front of the wheel, as she watched the compass and kept Nellie on course well, controlling the rudder with her finger on the tiny joystick beside her. Without the engine, there was no sound as this 180 feet long ship sailed gently between two of the Canary Islands.

It was the year 2000 and the first of my 16 voyages with this charity in different parts of the World on Nellie and her sister ship Tenacious, then still being built mainly by volunteers, some in wheelchairs. Both were to sail around the world with disabled people from many countries, visiting every continent, including Antarctica. Everyone on board helped to sail and run the ships, even the severely disabled. We enjoyed each other's company, learned a lot and rejoiced in each of our companions' achievements. Joy proved to be intelligent and good company, with a mischievous sense of humour.

Sadly, it was announced in December 2023 that this charity had at last been forced to close due to mounting financial difficulties. Since it was formed in 1978, at a time when there were few opportunities for them, the disabled have made great strides. They now have the paralympic games, wheelchair rugby and tennis, single-handed sailing, snowboarding and many other activities to choose from.



Maybe our charity was a victim of its own success.

However, I have to say that on that magic starlit night God seemed to me to be very close.

Those of us on Joy's watch who were on deck felt unusually privileged and will never forget being there. I would not have missed it for anything.
