The Year 4 children led a school service on Ash Wednesday all about Lent and the Year 2 Children will take the school service for Easter. They will sing songs, read bible stories and act out the story of Easter. Having the children in church for these services is such a joy and a blessing and seeing and hearing them sing with such enthusiasm would brighten anyone's day. And regardless of your belief it's good that they understand what Easter is celebrating.

As ever, our services will follow the Easter story... receiving our palm crosses on Palm Sunday and then later in the week we mark Maundy Thursday with supper together in the OJ Room, where we share an informal communion. (It is one of my favourite services of the year, and if you are interested then please sign up on the website). We will start our Good Friday service as always on the Village Green (unless it is absolutely pouring with rain!) as an Act of Witness and then in the afternoon we mark the final hour of Jesus's life with an hour of quiet bible reading and reflection. On Easter Sunday we have a joyful celebration to mark Jesus' resurrection - a service for all the family – and there will be chocolate!

And if I don't see you over the Easter holidays, my prayer is that you will find Hope wherever you are.
