On this 1700th anniversary - we say We Believe

The Nicene Creed originally dates to 1700 years ago when The Council of Nicaea, a gathering of Christian bishops met in Nicaea, now in present-day Türkiye in 325 AD. It was the first attempt to reach consensus in the church through an assembly representing all of Christendom, and to affirm the Christian faith in the triune God. This means that Christians believe in one God in three persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The creed is a comprehensive summary of the faith of the Church.

The Nicene Creed is the most widely-accepted creed in the Christian faith, used by many denominations including the Anglican Communion. It is a reminder of the common faith we share – both with Christians around the world today and throughout history with all those who have affirmed these words over the last seventeen centuries.



We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,

God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.



We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
