Jean White RIP

As many of you will know by now, Jean White our much loved organist died at home on 7th July aged 91 and her funeral was held here on 21st August.

Jean faithfully played the organ at All Saints for over 70 years. Having been brought to her church by her father Colin White, who was for many years the choir master, Jean's first service playing the organ was Harvest 1954 when she was just 20.

As well as Sunday services, many in the village will have heard Jean play the organ as they got married, welcomed new babies to baptism or grieved their losses. Jean not only played the organ most weeks, she also supported weekly Choir practice and used proceeds from her Good Book mornings to fund additional music books and awards.

Jean taught many, many children at Grayswood and St Bartholomew's schools, was seen out and about delivering the Runner and Harvest gifts. She organised Mothering Sunday

posies and kept the flowers in church and in the porch looking good;

Jean taught Sunday School; was on the PCC, the Pastoral Team, a member of WI and the Beehive, and many other things which made her such an integral part of making All Saints the very special church that it is.

Managing our Trees

As part of our desire to manage God's acre we've recently undertaken a survey of the churchyard trees.

We've received a donation of 36 whips for a single hedgerow, 14 whips for a small copse and fruit saplings from a partnership with Surrey County Council which we hope to plant in November (the next tree planting season). These will replace the hedging removed when the retaining wall was repaired.

They will also mitigate the loss of the ash trees which need to be felled over a three year period as they have 'die back'; the removal of the cypress (with die back in the crown); and the removal of two conifers which are damaging the graves and headstones. Watch this space ...



John Jeffrey RIP

John passed away recently, aged 91, in Moorlands Lodge Nursing Home, after a short illness.

John moved to Grayswood in 1987, with his first wife Oonagh, having previously worked as a lawyer in London, Nottingham and Hong Kong. They were both keen supporters of church and village life. When Oonagh died, he generously donated to the construction of the Village Hall, where the Oonagh Jeffrey meeting room is a memorial to her.

After Oonagh's death John moved away from Grayswood to marry Shirley, and lived in Loxhill. But he did not forget Grayswood, keeping an eye on the maintenance of Oonagh's grave, and serving for many years as a Trustee of the Friends of All Saints, where I was, as Chairman, fortunate to be working with him. He was always a very wise, and generous member of the team. As he got older and jazz concerts and open gardens were not for him, he would, with his twinkling smile, say: "If I give you a donation – do I need to come?"

John had a very active retirement and dedicated 19 years of service to The Meath Epilepsy Charity in Godalming, notably as Chair of Trustees. The Meath said of John, 'Under his guidance, our charity experienced a period of remarkable growth. His vision and determination brought about real and lasting improvements to the accommodation, care and opportunities available to the people we support.'

For very many years John was a Trustee of HHH Concerts; again, for some of those years I was Chairman and valued his wisdom and insight. He and Shirley were extremely loyal attendees of our concerts and in latter years they would be brought by a friend or member of the family.

Throughout his life, John was a keen and competitive sportsman, and played tennis and squash to a high level. He 'retired' from these sports several times but always made a comeback! He will be greatly missed by all who knew him. By Pauline Lamb


