Tim was created last spring by Year 6 pupil, Cressida Parker, at Grayswood CE Primary School. Following a school-wide competition to promote safety on our local roads, Cressida's design was picked as a winner from dozens of entries. Whilst Year 6 marks her final year in primary, she can take pride in the fact her artwork will be seen in the village and school for years to come.

The final piece came together in collaboration with one of the parents at the school, Emma Stokes, who runs and leads "Studio Simple"- a co working space for designers in Haslemere- and Blue Dot Display, who are based in Wormley.

"Tim is not just a mascot for the school, he is a symbol of our community," says Heidi, who is a parent in the village, "We all like to consider our surroundings, keep each other safe, respect the environment so Tim reminds us of just that- be slow and patient, lift share/cycle if we can and respect each other on the road."

"Slow And Steady" is the tag line of Tim. "Many of the themes we saw from the children's artwork centred on their safety- that's quite telling!" Continues Heidi.

Headteacher at Grayswood CE Primary, Hannah Cole, is thrilled with the new mascot and hopes that it will promote increased awareness among the community. "The children at Grayswood CE Primary School are so proud of their school and village and are eager to ensure that it is a safe place, both inside and out. They are excited to see the impact that Tim will make!"
